


Thank you for everything you have done for me without expecting anything in return.

What is labdoo?

Labdoo.org is a global, non-profit collaborative platform founded by a Catalan engineer and supported by a network of thousands of volunteers who work together to deliver unused laptops (loaded with educational software) to schools around the world. And all of this is done without generating additional CO2 emissions that threaten our planet. Since its founding and thanks to the collaboration of thousands of volunteers, the Labdoo humanitarian platform has delivered laptops to more than 2,500 schools in over 145 countries, operating through 500+ hubs spread across 5 continents, benefitting more than 800,000 students around the world.

Programa:

The collection and sanitizing of the devices (laptops or tablets) works in the following way:

Labdoo does not impose any economic or environmental cost on the school or planet, resulting in the circular economy reducing the global level of electronic waste while at the same time, helping to educate children and young people through access to information and the internet.

Deliver your device to the nearest Labdoo collection point located in a public library in your town.



Step

2

Boys and girls from different educational institutions collect the laptops from the nearest library and conduct sanitizing workshops where they install educational software for all ages and in more than 100 languages. The educational software includes, amongst other things, content on the core sciences, offline versions of Wikipedia, UNESCO modules, and all of the courses from Khan Academy, thus converting the once unused computer into a powerful resource and extensive library.

3

Through the global non-profit platform Labdoo.org, the laptops then travel across a collaborative human network to reach schools in need around the world.
