- 1. Produce well-educated, well-skilled graduates who are able to find good employment and provide for themselves and their families;
- 2. Focus on quality, not quantity, in education delivery to break cycles of poverty;

- 3. Nurture the whole child through school meals, access to a nurse, health education, and providing a safe learning environment; and
- 4. Provide gender equitable education opportunities, actively addressing the unique challenges associated with getting and keeping girls in school.

The school has now been operating for more than 13 years with ongoing expansion in response to demand for services, scores well-above national average on regionally standardized WASSCE exams, and high numbers of graduates going on to further education and training (>80% within 2 years of graduation).

Although the school's basic budgetary needs are covered by the DEAR Foundation, whose generosity cannot be overstated, our aspirations for developing our educational offerings for Liberian youth go beyond this foundation's current capacity.
