2. Project Description - Please explain about your project and how you will use the laptops (\*):

The project Konokai was established as an extension of a long-running skills training for Women – Konomusu – in Koidu. Both are run by the United Methodist Church on their premises with support from Germany, mainly by means of machinery and the necessary skills to use them. It is aimed at male youth from Koidu that finished or quit school without the necessary skills to earn an income or find employment and provides them with theoretical and practical skills in technical professions. The students choose either the carpentry or metalwork training. They spend one day a week with theoretical lessons (literacy, life skills, vocational theory, economical basics), two days a week with skills training and two days a week with practical work. The training centre is equipped with tools and machinery. Two head teachers (for metalwork and carpentry respectively) as well as six "trainers" that coach practical skills teach up to 50 students. The project needs laptops for the trainers, to do their administrational work, prepare their lessons or use them for constructional drawings. Another set of laptops would be needed for the theoretical training of the students – mainly literacy, basic maths and economical basics, but also professional theory – using suitable teaching programs.

	It is planned that a teacher from the partnering vocational school in Germany will soon be spending a 1-2 year period in Sierra Leone to teach the staff the necessary skills they need to use the equipment.
