- e. We designed a holiday programme for the other learners/residents in the community which is to be attended to in Schools holidays times but however our resources are still limited. Here, We hope to introduce other short courses like computer maintenance, graphics design, photography, videography among others to learners as these are income generating areas that can help learners set up their businesses thereafter.
